College Board Advanced Placement exam registration is open. Please see the BNHS website. Click on Our School, then Academics, and then Advanced Placement to access the PowerPoint and parent letter for information on how to register and pay for these exams, including deadlines and costs. **Please note that if you are registering for an AP exam for a single semester course that you are enrolled in for fall of 2018, the deadline to register and pay for these AP exams, AND be exempt from the fall semester exam, is Monday, 12/10/18.** The link to the AP registration/payment site (Total Registration) can be found in both the PowerPoint and the parent letter, and is also posted on the BNHS website under News.
