Voter Registration forms are available in both the BNHS Front Office & Counseling Office. Please complete the registration form in pen & seal it, then drop it in a U.S. mailbox (or give it to Mrs. Huizenga in the BNHS front office & she will mail it for you). *Your voter registration form may be mailed any date within 2 months of your 18th birthday or any date after you've turned 18. To cast your ballot in the May 2019 Election, you must mail in your voter's registration form in today, 4/4/19. If you have questions, talk with Mrs. Huizenga in the BNHS front office.
