Early voting starts this week in municipal elections. Students, if you are 18, or will have your 18th birthday in the next two months, you may fill out a voter registration form. The registration forms are available in the BNHS Front Office & Counseling Office. Please complete the registration form in pen & seal it, then drop it in the U.S. mail (or give it to Mrs. Huizenga in the BNHS front office & she will mail it for you). Your voter registration form may be mailed any date within 2 months of your 18th birthday or any date after you've turned 18. If you have questions, talk with Mrs. Huizenga in the BNHS front office.
