

# Medlin Middle School PTA Senior Scholarship Guidelines

Medlin Middle School PTA offers one \$500 scholarship, as permitted by the approved budget, to graduating Northwest ISD Seniors who will be enrolled in an accredited college or university or a technical/vocational institute in the summer or fall semester immediately following his/her high school graduation. Funds for the scholarships come from Medlin Middle School PTA membership, fundraising, and community sponsorships.

## Purpose of Scholarship

The purpose is to support Northwest ISD students who are focused on achieving career goals through higher education. In evaluating each application, the Scholarship Committee will consider service and participation in school activities, community involvement and scholastic merit.

## Eligibility Requirements

Applicant must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Applicant must have attended Medlin Middle School (minimum of one semester) and be a graduating High School Senior from any Northwest ISD high school
- Applicant must be a member of their high school PTSA. Applicant's name must be on the membership list as of March 30, 2020. (Membership Forms are available on the PTSA website.)
- Applicant must be enrolled in an accredited college or university or a technical/vocational institute in the summer or fall semester immediately following his/her high school graduation.
- A completed application and required documents must be received by 4:00 pm on April 12, 2020 to be eligible for consideration.

## Submission Requirements

In order to qualify, the applicant must complete and submit the following:

- Medlin Middle School PTA Senior Scholarship Application form (one page)
- Typed resume detailing school activities, community involvement and work experience (see sample on page 3)
- A copy of high school transcript (to validate current senior at a Northwest ISD HS)
- A 300 to 500 word essay (typed, double spaced using Times Roman 12 pt) discussing how the applicant's involvement and experience at Medlin, including PTA programs, prepared them for success at high school and beyond.

## Selection and Notification

Selection is made by a Selection Panel and processed by the Scholarship Committee of the Medlin Middle School PTA. Recipients will be acknowledged during their high school senior awards ceremony or via high school counselors office. The applicant chosen to receive Medlin Middle School PTA Senior Scholarship must submit a copy of their acceptance letter from the educational institution to the Medlin Middle School PTA by May 31, 2020. Upon receipt, a check for the scholarship amount will be sent directly to the educational institution.

All entries submitted to Medlin Middle School PTA become the property of Medlin Middle School PTA and will not be returned.
